Dear Chairman Corker and Ranking Member Menendez:

We the undersigned organizations would like to thank you for your historic leadership in addressing human trafficking worldwide through the introduction of The *End Modern Slavery Initiative Act of 2015*.

As you know, an estimated 21 million people are victims of human trafficking around the world. Human trafficking victims are men and women, boys and girls, U.S. citizens and foreign nationals. They are people exploited in fields and factories, brothels and motels, in fishing boats and mines. While slavery is illegal in every country in the world, cases of forced labor and sex trafficking are found all around the globe, including the United States.

While U.S. government agencies and many groups and organizations have taken significant steps toward fighting modern slavery, we need to take our efforts to the next level.

The *End Slavery Initiative Act* would authorize \$250 million in U.S. government funding over seven years to leverage a \$1.5 billion international fund dedicated to scaling solutions. This legislation represents the most dramatic increase in support for anti-human trafficking efforts we have ever seen.

This bold, bipartisan legislation would create a focused, sustained effort in collaboration with the private sector and other donor governments to eliminate sex and labor slavery worldwide. This model is designed to leverage limited foreign aid dollars and galvanize tremendous support and investment from the public sector, philanthropic organizations and the private sector to focus resources responsibly where this crime is most prevalent.

Thank you for demonstrating extraordinary leadership towards making a measureable impact in reducing the prevalence of modern slavery. We are proud to stand with you in support of the *End Modern Slavery Initiative Act*, a bold and historic step toward breaking the back of modern slavery in our generation.

We look forward to working with you and your staff to ensure this important legislation becomes law.
