

Gospel Reading: Gospel according to St. Mark (7:31-37)

Then Jesus returned from the region of Tyre and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech and they begged him to lay his hand on him.

He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly.

Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."

Silent Reflection

Question for Reflection/Sharing

When we first became aware of the AIDS pandemic, it was an issue that was often in the news and that weighed heavily on our hearts. We committed ourselves to developing "an appropriate response to the global pandemic," and we have been faithful to continuing to respond through prayer and action through the past three decades.

However, now that HIV and AIDS are treatable for many, this pandemic and those who suffer because of it have faded from the news and from our thoughts. An awareness of those suffering with HIV and AIDS most often reappears for many of us around the time of World AIDS Day.

What can we do, as individuals and communities, to keep those who suffer in any way from HIV and AIDS, in the forefront of our hearts, minds and prayers?
