For those with HIV/AIDS in Africa unable to receive necessary medications due to shortage in public hospitals, especially expectant mothers who need medications to stop transmission to their unborn child, we pray **R. Heal us, Oh God**

For all researchers who tirelessly work to discover vaccines and treatments for HIV/ AIDS and COVID-19, that their hands and skilled minds are guided by the wisdom and strength of the Spirit, we pray **R. Heal us, Oh God**

For all who work with people afflicted with HIV/AIDS, COVID-19 and other chronic diseases, health care professionals, paraprofessionals, domestic staff, missionaries, social workers and counselors. May they feel the strength and presence of Jesus, the Healer as they carry out their duties of comfort and care, we pray **R. Heal us, Oh God**
